- 7: benefit the Mexican police.
- 8: Section 4: This bill will go into effect one year after its
- 9: passage.
- 10: Section 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are
- 11: hereby null and void.

- 1: Section 1: The federal government may not loan or grant
- 2: money collected from taxpayers to any company in the
- 3: financial sector of the economy under any circumstance
- 4: Section 2: The federal government may not buy stocks or
- 5: shares of a company in the 6 financial sector of the economy
- 6: using money collected from taxpayers under any circumstances
- 7: Section 3: The provisions of this bill shall take effect
- 8: immediately after its passage.
- 9: Section 4: All laws or portions of laws in conflict with
- 10: this bill shall be null and void.

A Bill to Reform and Strengthen the U.S. Economy

- 1: Section I: With the exception of defense spending, all
- 2: government services and expenditures are hereby ended.
- 3: Section II: The national debt is to receive a final,
- 4: unchangable cap of \$15 trillion.
- 5: Section III: The national budget must always be balanced.
- 6: Emergency spending and resulting deficit spending are
- 7: permitted, so long as the spending is repaid within five
- 8: (5) years of use. In addition, all emergency spending must
- 9: be noted on, but not necessarily added to, the budget for
- 10: the fiscal year after use.
- 11: Section IV: A national flat tax of 15% is hereby implemented
- 12: on all citizens.
- 13: Section V: All government revenue, after defense spending,
- 14: is to go to reducing the national debt.
- 15: Section VI: All non-emergency measures must be approved by
- 16: the Congressional Budget Office.
- 17: Section VII: This reform will occur five (5) years after thi
- 18: bill is signed into law.
- 19: Section VIII: All laws in opposition to this bill are
- 20: rendered null and void.

- 1: Whereas: Japan has been under military restrictions since
- 2: World War II; and

- 6: military presence; and

- 11: Whereas: These obligations could cause troop casualties and

- 17: and Japan be revoked and US military restrictions on Japan

- 1: Section 1: Prostitution will hereby be legalized in all 50
- 2: states.
- 3: Section 2: All prostitutes must register for licenses.
- 4: Section 2A: To be licensed, prostitutes must be at least 21
- 5: years old.
- 6: Section 2B: All prostitutes receiving licenses must test
- 7: negative for all STDs.
- 8: Section 3: All prostitutes will be checked weekly for
- 9: various STDs.
- 10: Section 3A: All states shall grant appropriate funds for the
- 11: formation and upkeep of agencies designed for the purpose
- 12: of performing such checks.
- 13: Section 3B: The Department of Health and Human Services
- 14: shall designate which diseases must be checked for.
- 15: Section 4: Condoms are mandatory for both oral sex and
- 16: intercourse. Brothels must provide condoms for their
- 17: employees.
- 18: States that do not enact legislation in compliance with this
- 19: legislation will lose 25% of their federal highway funds.
- 20: This bill will go into effect 91 days after passage.
