

**A BILL TO TO ELIMINATE THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE’S EQUITABLE SHARING PROGRAM**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** The Department of Justice’s Equitable Sharing Program will be hereby  
3 abolished and all capital profits of federal asset forfeitures will hereafter be put into a  
4 fund designated for use by the U.S. Department of Education.

5 **SECTION 2.** “Federal asset forfeitures” are the money, cars, real estate and any other  
6 property seized by law enforcement due to suspicion of a federal crime that is in the care  
7 of federal law enforcement agencies. “Capital profits” of such forfeitures excludes only  
8 tangible property to be used for law enforcement purposes from the above definition.

9 **SECTION 3.** The Money Laundering and Asset Recovery Section (MLARS) of the  
10 Department of Justice will oversee both the dissolution of the Equitable Sharing Program  
11 and the distribution of profits of federal asset forfeitures.

12 A. MLARS will continue to oversee the return of tangible property to be  
13 used for law enforcement purposes to its appropriate jurisdiction.

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect on January 1, 2022.

15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and  
16 void.

**A Bill to Purchase All Assault Weapons From the American People By the Federal  
Government to Reduce Gun Violence**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED

THAT:

**SECTION 1.** The Federal Government will confiscate all assault-style weapons from the American gun-owners and purchase assault weapons from gun owners.

**SECTION 2.** Assault weapons will be defined as semiautomatic weapons, weapons able to accept detachable magazines, weapons with any of the following: pistol grip, forward grip, folding, telescoping, or detachable stock, grenade launcher, barrel shroud, or a threaded barrel.

**SECTION 3.** The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives shall oversee the enforcement of this legislation. The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives is a federal law enforcement organization within the Department of Justice. The estimated cost of the federal buyback of assault weapons is \$15 billion dollars if all the 15 million assault rifles are bought back at \$1,000 each.

**SECTION 4.** This piece of legislation will be implemented on February 14, 2021.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## **A Bill to Establish Congressional Term Limits**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED

THAT:

**SECTION 1.** All members of both the House and Senate shall have their opportunity of re-election restricted by congressional term limits.

**SECTION 2.** All members of the House shall serve a maximum of four terms. All members of the Senate shall serve a maximum of two terms.

A. These terms may be served consecutively or individually; however, the maximum number of terms will be four and two for the House and Senate, respectively.

B. Terms served in one body of Congress do not impede on an individual's ability to serve in another. For instance, if an individual wanted to serve four terms in the House and two in the Senate, they would have the ability to do so.

**SECTION 3.** The Federal Election Commission will oversee the enforcement of this legislation.

**SECTION 4.** This bill will be implemented by the fiscal year 2022.

**SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# **A Bill to Make Proxy Voting in the United States Congress Illegal**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Proxy voting in the United States Congress shall be illegal.

3 **SECTION 2.** Each member of the House of Representatives and Senate shall cast their  
4 own vote whenever votes are called for in their respective chamber.

5 **SECTION 3.** This legislation does not prohibit either chamber of the U.S. Congress  
6 from adopting procedures in the future which allow members to  
7 participate in Congressional business from locations other than the  
8 Congressional chambers in Washington D.C.

9 **SECTION 4.** This bill takes effect immediately upon passage.

10 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Mandate That All Domestic Violence Shelters Receiving Federal Funding Admit Victims Without Regard to Gender Identity**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 **SECTION 1.** Domestic violence shelters receiving federal funding may not discriminate  
3 on the basis of gender identity.

4 **SECTION 2.** Gender identity is defined as the personal sense of one’s own gender. It  
5 may or may not correlate with a person’s assigned sex at birth.

6 **SECTION 3.** The US Department of Health and Human Services will implement this  
7 legislation.

8 **A.** Shelters found in violation of this law will lose all federal funding until  
9 such time as they are able to demonstrate consistent compliance for at  
10 least two consecutive years.

11 **B.** Shelters shall be held liable for refusal of services based on gender  
12 which result in serious bodily injury and/or death to one or more  
13 victims of domestic violence.

14 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect by January of 2022.

15 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
